

CALL TO WORSHIP

When it comes to singing in worship to God, modern day Christians have a seemingly unending variety of choices. We have worship songs, choruses, and hymns. We can download chord charts and lyrics or flip through the pages of hymnals to find the song we would like to sing. However, there is one place that God has specifically ordained for us to draw our worship from: the book of Psalms. Psalms are not the only valid source for our musical worship; Paul mentions "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs" in both Colossians and Ephesians. However, the Book of Psalms is the only inspired, inerrant source for our worship.

In our church, we do not usually sing psalms word-for-word in our corporate worship. We do sing many songs that are based on or are different arrangements of certain psalms. And also, every Sunday morning to open our service, we recite a psalm for our Call to Worship. This Sunday, we will begin a new psalm – Psalm 24 – that we will use for the rest of the year to help draw our hearts and minds towards the worship of God.

Psalm 24 is a wonderful psalm for helping us direct our attention to God. This psalm is full of commands for those who are hearing to look towards God and focus their attention on Him. It is a call to

live with holines and purity - reflecting the nature of God to the world. It is full of descriptors of who God is and what He has done. He is creator, sovereign, holy, glorious, strong, mighty. He is he Lord of Hosts and He is the King of Glory!

So this Sunday, when we recite this psalm together for the first time, ask God to use these ancient lyrics to help your heart and mind focus on Him. Ask Him to help you to look to Jesus for your righeousness, that you might come before Him with clean hands and a pure heart. May the words of this psalm help us know our God more fully and declare His glory and majesty!
