The holiday season is a time of year that can't just "sneak up" on someone. It would be difficult to miss the holiday displays in stores, Christmas songs playing everywhere you go, or all the festivals, parties, and events that pop up right after Thanksgiving. Despite this, we may not be fully ready to focus on and celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. The classic Christmas song Joy to the World instructs "every heart [to] prepare Him room" and our church has several things available to help prepare room in our hearts to celebrate the birth of our Savior.

We begin our church celebration of Christmas well before Christmas Day every year by incorporating Advent into our schedule. Each Sunday leading up to December 25, we light an Advent candle and celebrate what it represents. We also have our Advent series *Troubled at Christmas*

This weekend, we look forward to our annual Ladies' Christmas Culture Exchange. Along with this, we are collecting the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering during December and January. All designated donations go directly to support international mission work. Our church's goal this year is \$5000. We hope that this focus on God's work among the nations will help you remember that Jesus came for all people. Then during our normal Sunday evening service time on December 10, our Ekids will be presenting a special program 'Twas the Night Before Christmas. Pastor Matt McBroom, his team, and the kids have been working hard on this for several weeks. Please come out and support our kid's ministry and be reminded about the true meaning of Christmas!

Finally on Christmas Eve, we will have two services: our Sunday morning service to wrap up our Advent series and then our traditional Candlelight Service at 6:00 PM. The candlelight service is a family service designed to focus our minds on the Lord before the celebration of Christmas Day. Through all the events, programs, and activities of the Christmas season, may you make every effort to prepare room for the Savior who has come – to know Him, to worship Him, and to love Him even more!

He Will Be Great!

"Hey, how was the concert last night?" they asked.

"Oh, it was great! We had such a good time. We loved it!" they responded.

Greatness is a simply-profound way of describing something awesome! Greatness can be describing the large size of something. Or greatness can be describing how something is very good.

In Luke 1:32 when the angel is telling the Virgin Mary about the coming birth of her son Jesus, the angel gives this simply-profound expression to the soon to be born Savior Jesus - "He will be great."

The message is to the mother, Mary. Her son will be great. And great He is! In fact, He was great, He is great, and He will always be great. He is the eternal son of God. And just like "of His kingdom there will no end," so of His greatness there will be no end.

How great is Jesus?

To be fair, His greatness is inexhaustible. He is 100% God and 100% human. And there is so much that could be said about how great Jesus is

In the context of this passage with the foretelling of His birth, His authority and power and reign are in view. The Bible says He has a throne. The Bible says He will reign forever. And the Bible says He has a kingdom that will never end. That undeniably is greatness. He is great!

But His power and authority are only one of many ways to see His

greatness. Another way to see His greatness is in the very reason that He came to us. In Matthew 1, when a different angel tells a different person the same message - that the Savior is coming as a baby. There we have this clear explanation, "for He will save His people from their sins" (Matt. 1:21).

Here we see His greatness from a different angle. Not only does He have power and authority, He also is savior of sinners. He reigns as King, but He also serves as Savior. This is greatness! He is great!

As you enjoy this holiday season, let me encourage you to think more upon how great Jesus is.

Remind yourself of truths like these:

- He knows your every thought and move
- He sees you where you are
- He cares for you
- He is always with you
- He gives more grace
- He is able to save to the uttermost
- As far as the East is from the West, He has removed our sins from us
- He will return one day
- He loves the outcast
- He cares about our needs and He provides for our needs
- He forgives sins

Wow! I think I could just keep adding and adding to that list in thinking about how great Jesus is.

How about you? Remember this early Christmas statement. So simply-profound - *He will be great!*

BEING A CHURCH THAT PRAYS

We have been reciting Psalm 24 during our Call to Worship since July. As we finish up the year, let's pray through some of the verses of this psalm:

- Thank God for His power and sovereign rule over all creation (vs. 1-2)
- Praise God for His holiness how He is entirely good and set apart from humanity (v. 3)
- Ask the Holy Spirit to empower you to live a life of holiness and purity (v. 4)
- Thank God for the blessing of your salvation in Jesus Christ. Praise Him for His righteousness that covers your sin (v. 5)
- Pray that you would be strengthened to seek the Lord (v. 6)
- Praise God for his glory, His strength, and His majesty. Pray that God would help you declare His greatness to those around you (v. 7-10)
